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

# STAR Reading

STAR Reading is a Kindergarten–12th grade comprehensive reading assessment.

It identifies reading strategies and skills needed for students to reach grade-level proficiency and achieve mastery.

## Lexile Level

- A Lexile measure is a score that matches a student's reading ability with text.
- Lexiles range from Beginning Reader (BR) to 1600L.
- A Lexile can be interpreted as the level of text that a student can read with 75 % comprehension.

## What is Accelerated Reader (AR)?


Accelerated Reader is an online assessment that quizzes your child on the books they have read.

There are three steps to using Accelerated Reader:

- 1. Students choose and read a fiction or a non-fiction book in their Lexile range. Students may read them individually, with a partner, or in a small group.
- 2. Students take a quiz on the book using the computer.
- 3. The Accelerated Reader program keeps track of the number of words your child reads, the number of books your child reads, their reading level and their comprehension skills.



 Home Connect allows you to view information about your child's progress. It also allows you to sign up to receive email notifications after your child completes an activity or assessment at school.


### How do I access Home Connect?

# How can you help?

- Make sure your child is reading books in his/her Lexile range.
- Encourage your child to read at home. Provide a space and time for your child to read daily.
- Ask questions about what he/she is reading
  - Who is in your book? (Characters)
  - Where does it take place? (Setting)
  - What happened first/next/at the end? (Plot)
  - o What did you think about the book?

## What are other ways I can help?

- Visit your local library
- Let your child see you reading
- Reading with your child, no matter what the child's age, is an important part of developing a good reader, building a lifelong love of reading and learning, and creating a loving relationship between you and your child. Make learning a family affair!
