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## Georgia Milestones Assessment System

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System is a comprehensive summative assessment program and represents a single system of summative assessments that span all three levels of the state's educational system elementary, middle, and high school. The system is designed to send consistent signals about students' preparedness for the next level, be it the next grade, course, or endeavor, such as entering college or beginning a career after leaving the K-12 educational system.

## What is the purpose of Georgia Milestones?

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System is designed to provide information about how well students are mastering the state-adopted content standards in the core content areas of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

## How is the Georgia Milestones administered?

Georgia Milestones is administered primarily on the computer and includes the following features:

- Technology-enhanced items in all grades and courses,
- Open-ended (constructed response) items in English language arts in all grades and courses,
- A writing component (in response to passages read by students) at every grade level and course within the English language arts assessment,
- A reported Lexile score based on the English language arts assessment in all grades and courses, and
- Estimated norm-referenced performance ranges for all grades and courses.

## Reading

- Lexile: A measure that provides information about either an individual's reading ability or the difficulty of a text, like a book or magazine article.
- Score: The Lexile measure is shown as a number with an "L" after it - 880L is 880 Lexile.

## Promotion \& Retention Policy

## State Rule Requirements for Grades Three, Five, and Eight

A. Promotion of a student shall be determined as follows:

1. No third-grade student shall be promoted to the fourth grade if the student does not achieve grade level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in reading and meet promotion standards and criteria established in reading in this policy. Students who receive a reading designation of Below Grade Level is retained and is eligible to retest.
2. No fifth-grade student shall be promoted to the sixth grade if the student does not achieve grade level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in reading and the Georgia Milestones Assessment in mathematics and meet promotion standards and criteria established in this policy. Students who receive a reading designation of Below Grade Level is eligible to retest. Students who receive Beginning Learner in mathematics are retained and are eligible to retest.

## Promotion \& Retention Policy

When a student does not perform at grade level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in grades 3,5 , and 8 , and also does not perform at grade level on a second opportunity to take the assessment, then the following shall occur.

## Promotion \& Retention Policy

 Grades 3 through 5To meet promotion requirements students in grades 3-5 must: Obtain a passing grade(70) in:

- Mathematics
- Reading

Obtain a passing grade (70) in two of the following:

- Social Studies
- Science
- Language Arts (English, Spelling, Composition)
